Horse Events Rules and Regulations

1. The committee reserves the right to substitute prize money with goods of equal value.
2. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
3. The Committee's decision is final.
4. The Judge's decision is final.
5. Mt Morgan Show Society Inc will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage.
6. The age of a horse shall be calculated from 1st August. Every horse foaled before this date of that year shall be deemed to be one year old on 1st August.
7. A maiden horse is one which has not won a first place in a maiden, novice or open event at an Agricultural Show.
8. A novice horse is one which has not won an open championship at an Agricultural Show.
9. Junior competitors are to be under the age of 17 years on the day of the show.
10. Stallions will not be permitted in hack classes.
11. Ponies must not exceed 14 hands.
12. Shetland ponies must not exceed 10.2 hands.
13. Miniature ponies must not exceed 8.2 ¼ hands.
14. A Galloway is a horse measuring over 14 hands but not exceeding 15 hands.
15. No ring shall be required to wait for competitors in another ring.
16. The Show Society may carry out random tests for drugs in horses.
17. Horses and competitors must be presented in appropriate gear.
18. Stallions must be controlled at all times.
19. Nominations will be ticket system, available from the Secretary's office.
20. Less than 3 competitors in a class, only first place will be paid.
21. All riders compete at their own risk.
22. Helmets must be worn in all sporting events.
23. Protests may be lodged with the Secretary within 15 minutes of event.
24. A fee of \$50 must be submitted with the protest, refundable only if protest is won.
25. Prizes are to be collected on Show Day.
26. Uncollected prize money will be deemed a donation after 5 days.
27. All horse events will be suspended for the duration of the Grand Parade so that competitors, place getters and champions can participate.

1. Enter arena at a walk

Open: Canter a figure of eight then a larger figure of eight with flying changes of lead;

Junior: Trot a figure of eight, then canter a larger figure of eight with simple or flying changes. 10 points

2. Fast straight canter with roll back over hocks to left 180°, fast canter with roll back over hocks to right 180°. 10 points

3. Fast canter with sliding stop followed by rein back and calm walk. 10 points

4. Dismount & ground the horse, rider must walk away 20 paces. Return and mount (open competitors only). 10 points

5. Walk to judge and demonstrate to Judge that horse will allow use of whip (open competitors only). 10 points

6. Transfer object from point A to point B without dismounting. If object is dropped to the ground zero points will be awarded. 10 points

- Clothing & equipment must demonstrate the competitor is ready for a day's work as a stockman.
- Jeans will be accepted, but a saddle with horn will not be accepted.
- Stock whip must be carried at all times (open competitor only)
- Riders and horses will be judged out of a possible total of 60 points (30 horse/30 rider) except junior competitors who will be judged out of a possible total of 40 points (20 horse/20 rider). Score sheets will be available on completion of event.

Show Societies General Rules for Competition

1. The Show Society reserves the right to substitute prize money with voucher or goods to the equal value.
2. The attention of intending exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the rules of the Qld Chamber of Agricultural Societies and to the constitution and rules of the Society in addition to any special regulations which appear within this schedule.
3. Once in the hands of the Stewards, exhibits must not be handled without the consent of the Chief Steward. If, in the Chief Steward's opinion and exhibit is entered in the wrong class, such exhibit may be re-classed and judged accordingly. If insufficient entries occur in a class, the Chief Steward may have a Judge award a reduced number of prizes.

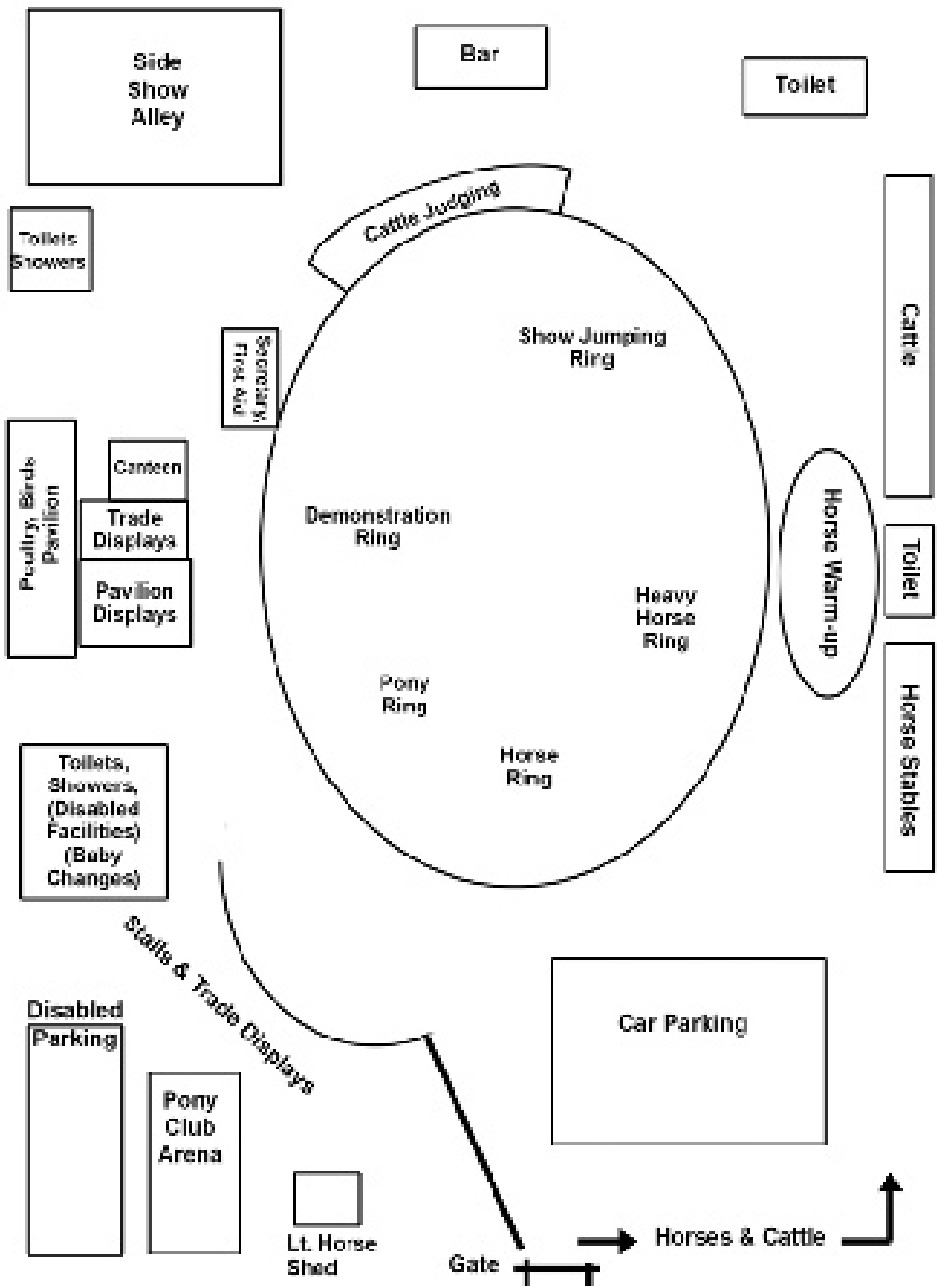
