Horse Events Rules and Regulations

1. The committee reserves the right to substitute prize money with goods of equal value.
2. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
3. The Committee's decision is final.
4. The Judge's decision is final.
5. Mt Morgan Show Society Inc will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage.
6. The age of a horse shall be calculated from 1st August. Every horse foaled before this date of that year shall be deemed to be one year old on 1st August.
7. A maiden horse is one which has not won a first place in a maiden, novice or open event at an Agricultural Show.
8. A novice horse is one which has not won an open championship at an Agricultural Show.
9. Junior competitors are to be under the age of 17 years on the day of the show.
10. Stallions will not be permitted in hack classes.
11. Ponies must not exceed 14 hands.
12. Shetland ponies must not exceed 10.2 hands.
13. Miniature ponies must not exceed 8.2 ¼ hands.
14. A Galloway is a horse measuring over 14 hands but not exceeding 15 hands.
15. No ring shall be required to wait for competitors in another ring.
16. The Show Society may carry out random tests for drugs in horses.
17. Horses and competitors must be presented in appropriate gear.
18. Stallions must be controlled at all times.
19. Nominations will be ticket system, available from the Secretary's office.
20. All riders compete at their own risk.
21. Helmets to current pony club standard must be worn in all sporting and show jumping events.
22. Protests may be lodged with the Secretary within 15 minutes of event.
23. A fee of \$50 must be submitted with the protest, refundable only if protest is won.
24. Prizes are to be collected on Show Day
25. Uncollected prize money will be deemed a donation after 5 days.
26. All horse events will be suspended for the duration of the Grand Parade so that competitors, place getters and champions can participate.
27. Any horse or person, regardless of sex, displaying unruly, dangerous or out of control behaviour, may be asked to leave the arena.
28. At the Judges discretion, any person displaying rude or unsporting behaviour may be asked to leave the arena with the resulting forfeiture of all nominations
29. When being led or ridden, all stallions over the age of 2 years must be under the control of the bit.
30. All stallions must be double tied or housed in stables when not being ridden or handled.
31. All stallions must only be handled by persons over the age of 18.

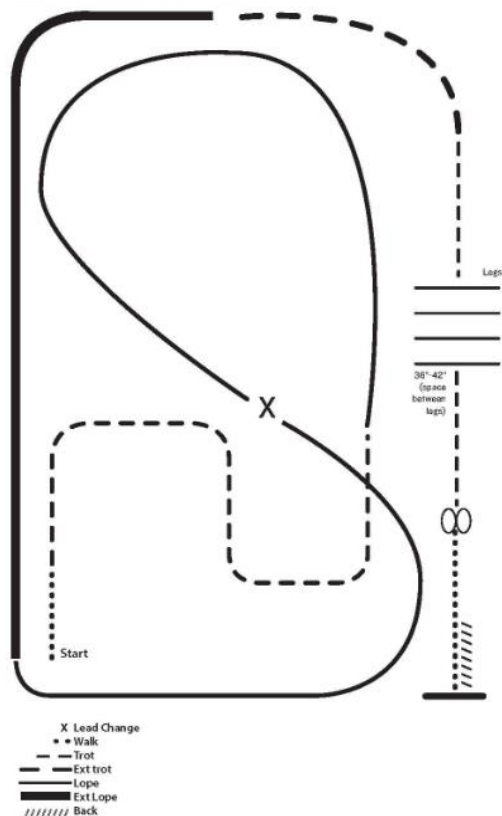
Figure of 8 Race

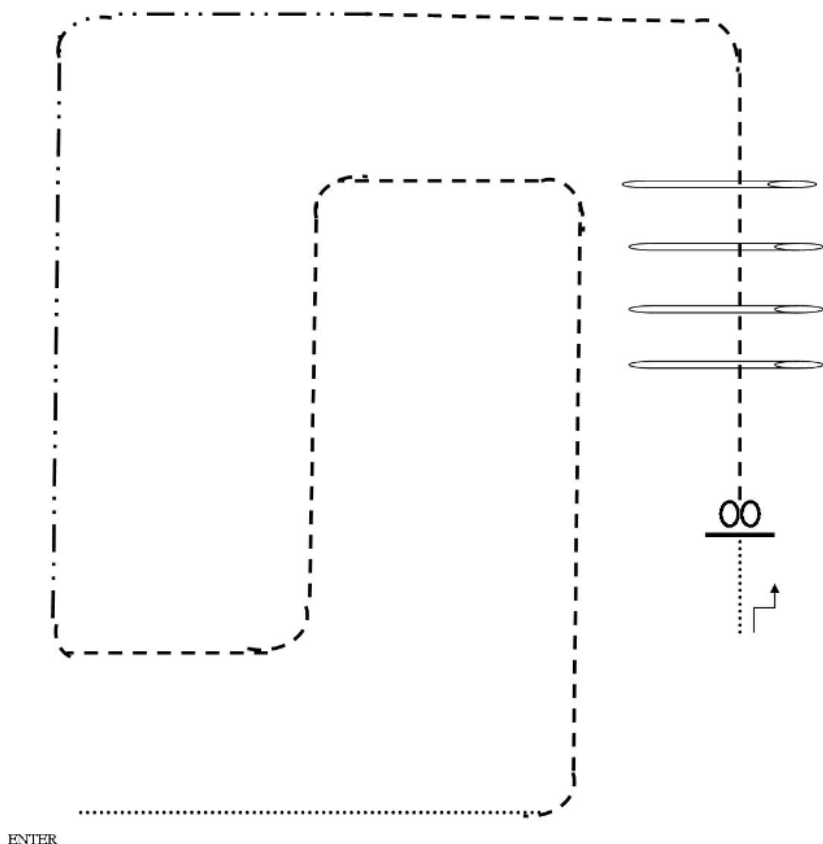

11. Walk, stop and back

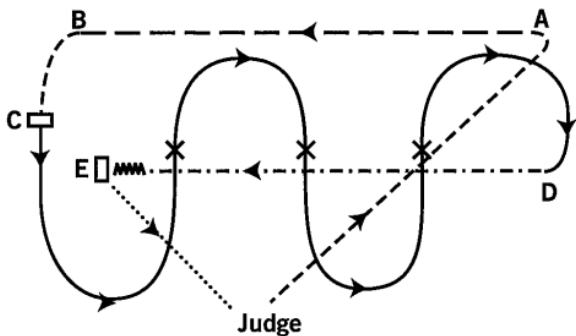

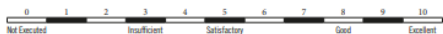

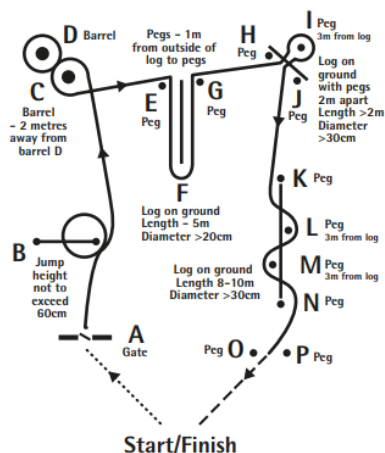

Course

- Commence course between the start/finish pegs at a Walk. Walk to gate at A. Once the rider's hand touches the gate, the horse may continue the course at any pace to the pegs at O and P.
- Open the gate, pass through and close the gate - the gate latch must be securely fastened.
- Continue past the jump at B, leaving the jump on the near side of the horse. Turn and jump the jump, continue to circle around the end of the jump to the barrel at C.
- Leave barrel C on the near side of the horse, circle anti-clockwise half a circle around barrel C, circle barrel at D clockwise a full circle and then circle C anti-clockwise half a circle to complete figure of eight (Note: two metre distance between the edges of barrel C and D). Continue to the peg at E.
- Leave the peg E on the off side of the horse, complete a 90° turn to the right and continue along the length of log at F.
- At the end of log F, turn 180° around the end of the log and continue along the other side of log F towards peg G. Leaving peg G on the off side of the horse, turn 90° and continue towards log between pegs H and J.

7 At peg H, jump the log between the pegs, then around peg I on the off side of the horse and jump back over log at J and continue towards peg K.

8 Jump log between pegs K and N three (3) times in a serpentine motion, starting with peg K on left and going around pegs L and M with final jump having peg N on right. Come back to trot between O and P.

9 Continue to O, reducing the pace of the horse to a Trot prior to crossing a line between the pegs O and P. (Note: 1 metre distance between the O and P pegs)

10 Then continue at a Trot to start/finish pegs. Horse must Trot between the start/finish pegs to complete the course.

Rules

- The time commences and terminates when the horse's nose crosses the line between the start/finish pegs.
- A one (1) second penalty will be incurred for each stride that is broken in the Walk and Trot sections.
- A three (3) second penalty will be incurred if the gate, jumps, barrels at C and D; the logs at F, H or K or any peg from E through P is dislodged.
- When jumping the log at H and K, the horse's four feet must touch the ground on the other side of the obstacle before returning over the log. Failure to do so will result in elimination.
- A horse will be eliminated for not completely and correctly negotiating any section of the course.
- Head restraints are not permitted.
- The Walk section must be a four beat pace Walk. Penalties will be incurred for any break in beat.
- A one (1) second penalty will be incurred for each hoof which crosses the log at F.
- Penalties will be added to the time and the time will become the score for this section.
- The horse with the lowest score will be determined as the winner.

Safety

For safety, if logs of less than the designated diameters are not available, the logs MUST be securely pinned to the ground in order to prevent all movement.

Note

In their age group riders under 13 years of age must open the gate but do not have to close it.

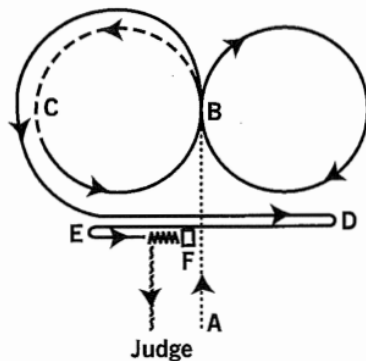

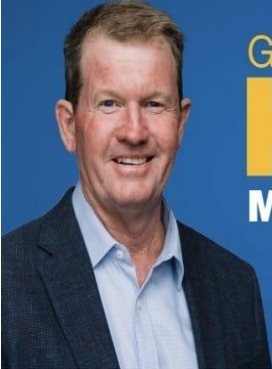
